

Places to Study in the Libraries

Library West

- ✦ **General study areas, some talking allowed.**
 - ▷ First, second, and third floors.
- ✦ **Individual silent study area.**
 - ▷ First, fourth, and sixth floors. The sixth floor is reserved for graduate students.
- ✦ **Group Studies**
 - ▷ Seventeen general group studies provide space for collaborative work for groups of up to ten persons. They may be signed out at the circulation desk on the second floor. See policy at <http://www.uflib.ufl.edu/ps/circ/studyroompolicy.html>.
 - ▷ One 10-person group study room is equipped for teleconferences.
 - ▷ Two group studies are equipped with specialized ADA and digital media equipment. They may be signed out at the research assistance desk on the third floor.
- ✦ **Individual graduate and faculty studies**

 - ▷ Third and Fourth Floors
- ✦ **Individual silent study area.**
 - ▷ Fifth Floor
- ✦ **Study Carrels**
 - ▷ Located on the third, fourth, and fifth floors, a limited number of carrel spaces, including a small locker, are assigned to graduate students through a lottery. Graduate students in the sciences, humanities, and social sciences may apply. Applications are available at the circulation desk. Assignments are for one semester and may be extended for additional semesters if space is available.

 - ▷ Main Study Area.
- ✦ **Group study and discussion areas.**
 - ▷ Two reservable study rooms (ask at the circulation desk).

 - ▷ Latin American Collection (Fourth Floor)
- ✦ **Individual silent study area.**
 - ▷ Special & Area Studies Collections (Second Floor)

- ✦ **General Study Areas, some talking allowed**
 - ▷ Throughout the library
- ✦ **Group and individual study rooms (HSC ID required)**
 - ▷ 2nd and 3rd floors- check out at circulation desk
- ✦ **Individual silent study area**
 - ▷ 3rd floor
- ✦ **24/7 study area (HSC ID required)**
 - ▷ Blue Room (Communicore Bldg 2nd floor SW corner)
